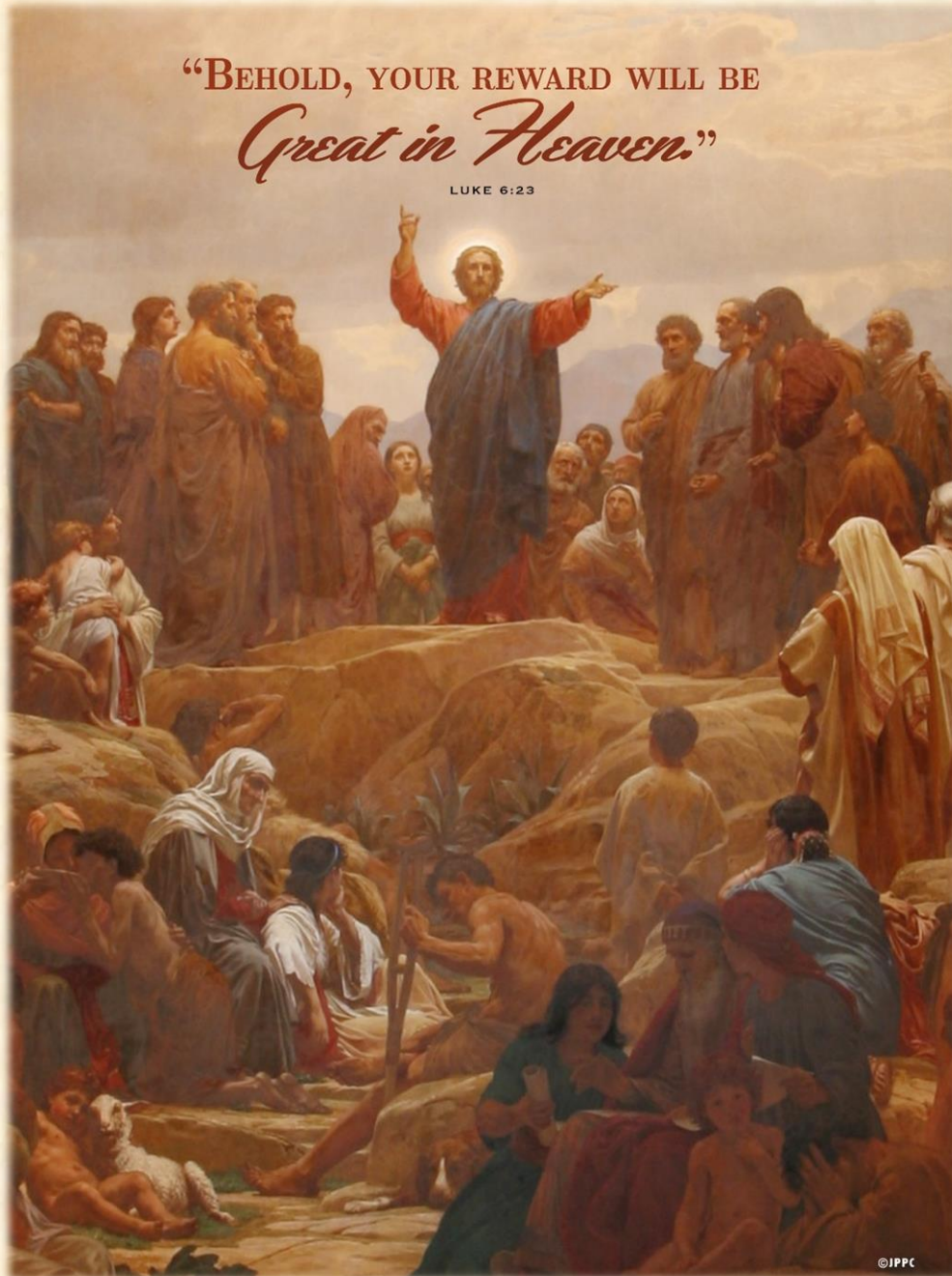

From Father Rodney

Trust! We are called to place our trust in so many things. We make decisions each and every day and we trust that we are making the right ones. Husbands and wives trust that they are making the right decision when marrying their intended spouse making a sacred promise until death do them part. I trusted that the Spirit was calling me to ordained priesthood. Individuals trust that they are making the correct decision when changing jobs when a new opportunity arises in their career. We have all been encouraged to trust the science when it comes to the safety and efficacy of the Covid-19 vaccine as it has proven to be a rather divisive subject. Trust. It requires a great deal of thought, prayer, faith and hope. The prophet Jeremiah, whose prophetic words we hear this 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time are both sobering and helpful. Jeremiah gives us clarity when it comes to the issue of trust. He writes, "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings...whose heart turns away from the Lord. He is like a barren bush in the desert that enjoys no change of season but stands in a lava waste, a salt and empty earth." Doesn't sound too inviting, does it? When we place our trust solely on the whim of another, so it seems, nothing healthy or helpful will come about. Jeremiah, however, offers us a great sense of hope as the reading continues: "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord. He is like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream: it fears not the heat when it comes; its leaves stay green; in the year of drought it shows not distress, but still bears fruit." Trusting in the Lord, is the way to be sustained here and now. Trusting in the Lord, even when we are in relationships, is the way, according to the Prophet, that we are sustained and grow. Trusting in the Lord always requires a great deal of hope as we sing in our psalm response. As we continue our journey as disciples of the Lord, let us continue to grow in the trust that our God will never lead us astray, but rather, lead us to living waters that helps us to grow into the disciples He is calling us to become.

In less than a month, we will usher in the Season of Lent. I don't want to put the cart before the horse but, I would like to bring your attention to a few additional Lenten practices that will be offered. On Friday evenings, I will be in the confessional between 6:00PM-6:25PM for confessions. At 6:30, Stations of the Cross will be prayed followed by the celebration of Mass at 7:00PM. A series of Information Nights will be held in the months to come. Zoom sessions will be held on Saturday, February 19, 2022, Monday, March 21, 2022 and May 29, 2022 from 7:00 – 8:30 pm. In person sessions will be held on Monday, June 27, 2022, and Sunday, August 14, 2022, from 7:00 pm – 8:30 pm. Registration is required and may be completed on our website. All the sessions cover the same material.
