

## *From Father Rodney*

In just three days, we will begin the solemn season of Lent. I usually do not speak about Lent until it arrives but the second reading that we hear proclaimed at Mass this 8th Sunday of Ordinary Time before we transition into Lent this coming Ash Wednesday has moved me to consider offering a few thoughts on the subject. We will hear on Ash Wednesday the very same Gospel that we have heard each Ash Wednesday: Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18. It is Jesus's signature teaching on how we are to act, and he outlines three acts we are to perform in order to be righteous: Fasting, praying and almsgiving. Most Catholics I know tend to focus on the fasting, i.e., what am I going to give up for Lent. Chocolate; snacking in between meals; desserts; alcohol etc. We all know that we tend to make fasting the one thing that we focus on, and prayer and almsgiving seem to fall by the wayside. I always say that I don't usually give up anything, but I try to do more. More time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament; visiting the homebound with greater frequency and the like. Well, this year, I think that I am going to focus on fasting and it's all thanks to Saint Paul and the letter he penned to the Community living in Corinth. Saint Paul is consumed with being "fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain". He reminds the community that our focus should be on what the Lord wants us to work on in terms of our role as His disciples. Hummm... perhaps as a community we could focus on "giving up" judging our brothers and sisters as we heard in last week's Gospel. Now there is something that could serve as a true fast but even more importantly, if we give up harsh and unfair judgments maybe we could retrain our hearts and minds to give them up forever? Would not that be a great gift to yourself and to others? Just something to think about as we transition into a season that is meant to bring about interior change as we return to the Lord seeking his mercy and loving forgiveness.

Did you know that many families with babies and toddlers cannot afford to buy enough diapers to change their babies as needed? Sadly, if babies are not changed often enough throughout the day, medical treatment for a variety of issues may be required. Benjamin Bonville, a Boy Scout in Troop 23 North Attleboro, will be conducting his Eagle Project by running a Diaper Dive to serve to help the mothers and families of North Attleboro and Attleboro. All of the donations will be distributed to Abundant Hope Pregnancy Recourse Center. There is no government agency that will contribute to the rising cost of diapers, not even WIC or SNAP! During the month of March, Benjamin and his fellow Scouts will be collecting diapers of any size. The Diaper Drive Eagle Project will run March 1st through 31st. Aware, that diapers are expensive, perhaps, you could share the cost with friends. There will be pack 'n plays in the main entrance entrances of the all churches for your donations beginning March 1st and continuing through the month of March. This weekend, February 26/27 Benjamin and other Scouts will be distributing flyers after Masses, explaining the Eagle Project Diaper Drive.
