From Father Rodney

I don't know about you but when I hear about disease and incurable illnesses my heart goes out for those who suffer and those who are charged with taking care of them. Perhaps my compassion stems from years working in hospital ministry or the simple fact that my own family is no stranger to heart disease, cancer and brain trauma, but my heart always aches for the sick. Of course, there are some types of illnesses that we have no control over. Unfortunately, we might succumb to disease because of a genetic predisposition, which would be out of our control but there are things that we can do in this life to take care of ourselves ensuring good health. At this time of the year, as we celebrate a New Year, many of us make promises to exercise, eat more fruit and less fatty foods, all of this is good, especially in light of the second reading that Saint Paul wrote to the Christian Community living in Corinth. Saint Paul reminds the Corinthians that "your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit [who is] within you." Taking care of ourselves for reasons pertaining to a healthy lifestyle is all well and good but we also must remind ourselves that God's Spirit dwells in us and for that reason, we are a living temple of God and should respect our bodies as such. This new year is only 17 days old. It is not too late to remember how we must treat our bodies – with great respect!

It is unfathomable that in just one month we will be welcoming the holy season of Lent. Parishioners have already asked me about the distribution of Ashes. The answer: a plan has not yet been put into place. I hope that will be able to announce both an indoor and outdoor plan real soon. I ask all those who want an outdoor option to pray to Saint Medardus who is the patron saint of the weather, vineyards, brewers, captives and prisoners, the mentally ill, and peasants. First Reading

A reading from the first Book of Samuel

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep."

At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Glory to you, O Lord. †

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.
