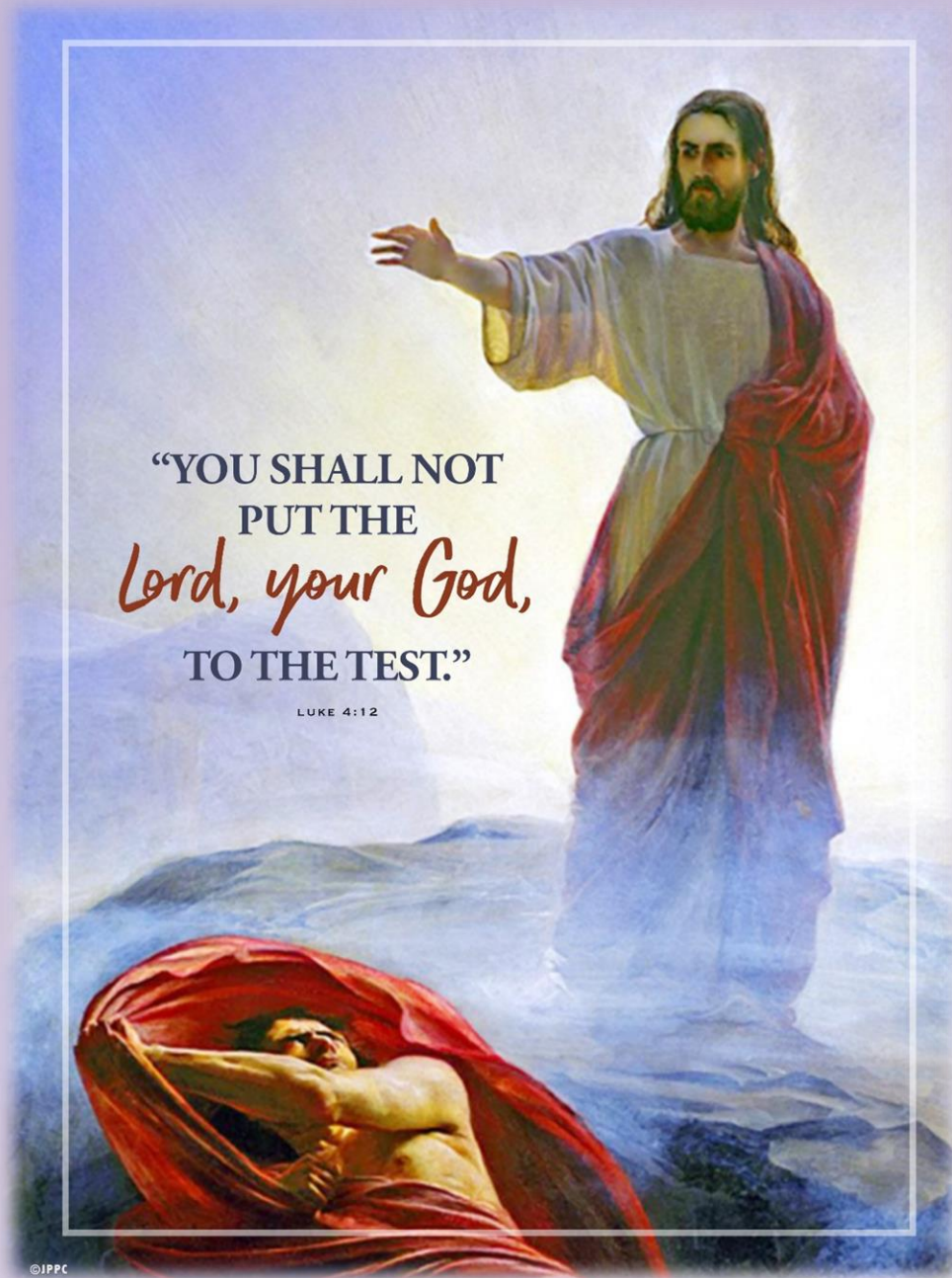

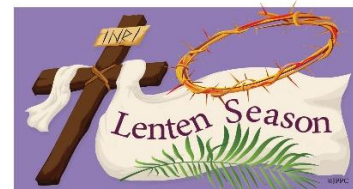

## *From Father Rodney*

Lent! The 40 day period when we look inward and ask the Lord to blow away the cobwebs that have crept into our minds and hearts since last Lent. Seriously, we need a time like Lent when we can take stock of our lives and relationships and be honest with ourselves about how we have been acting like disciples of Jesus. Lent is the time when we take inventory of ourselves and throw out what we no longer need. Our readings set the tone for the beginning of our Lenten journey: we hear of temptation and how it leads to sin. There is not one person reading these words who has never experienced these two things. Temptation can get the best of us leading us into sin but Jesus's own refusal to give into temptation shows us that overcoming temptation is a real possibility...although, it is not easy. We can be tempted by all sorts of things. We can be tempted to over-indulge. We can be tempted to be harsh or critical of another. We can be tempted to hold fast to a grudge and refuse to forgive someone who has wronged us. Temptation takes many different shapes and forms but it all leads us to sin. This Lenten season, let's see how we can overcome the temptations of the devil and remain true to our baptismal call to always follow Christ. Perhaps one way to prepare for the season of Lent leading to the joys of Easter is to experience the gift of God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In addition to the 3:00-3:30PM time period of Saturday afternoons, I will be in the Confessional at Saint Mary Church between 6:00-6:25 PM each Friday during Lent. The gift of God's forgiveness is so liberating. We can leave our troubles and burdens in God's hands thereby allowing us greater freedom to always follow the Son!

## Notes for Lent

As is recommended in the rubrics, during the season of Lent (and later in Easter) we will be using the Apostles' Creed in lieu of the Nicene Creed. This briefer, earlier Creed is a good way for us to keep an ancient practice alive. The Apostles' Creed can be found on page 10 in the missalette. We will also use the Penitential Act found on page 4 and below.

## Apostles' Creed

I believe in God,  
the Father Almighty,  
Creator of Heaven and earth;  
and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the Virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended into hell;  
on the third day he rose again from the dead;  
he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right  
hand of God, the Father almighty;  
from there he will come to judge the living and the  
dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy Catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body  
and life everlasting. Amen

## Penitential Act

I confess to almighty God  
and to you, my brothers and sisters,  
that I have greatly sinned,  
in my thoughts and in my words,  
in what I have done and in what I have failed to do,  
through my fault, through my fault,  
through my most grievous fault;  
therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin,  
all the Angels and Saints,  
and you, my brothers and sisters,  
to pray for me to the Lord our God.

## **Lenten Regulations for Fast & Abstinence**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

**A reading from the Book of Deuteronomy**

Moses spoke to the people, saying: “The priest shall receive the basket from you and shall set it in front of the altar of the LORD, your God. Then you shall declare before the Lord, your God, ‘My father was a wandering Aramean who went down to Egypt with a small household and lived there as an alien. But there he became a nation great, strong, and numerous. When the Egyptians maltreated and oppressed us, imposing hard labor upon us, we cried to the LORD, the God of our fathers, and he heard our cry and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. He brought us out of Egypt with his strong hand and outstretched arm, with terrifying power, with signs and wonders; and bringing us into this country, he gave us this land flowing with milk and honey. Therefore, I have now brought you the firstfruits of the products of the soil which you, O LORD, have given me.’ And having set them before the LORD, your God, you shall bow down in his presence.”

**A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans**

Brothers and sisters: What does Scripture say?

*The word is near you,*

*in your mouth and in your heart*

—that is, the word of faith that we preach—, for, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. For the Scripture says, *No one who believes in him will be put to shame.* For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all, enriching all who call upon him. For “everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

**Glory to you, O Lord. †**

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and when they were over he was hungry. The devil said to him, “If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread.” Jesus answered him, “It is written, *One does not live on bread alone.*” Then he took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a single instant. The devil said to him, “I shall give to you all this power and glory; for it has been handed over to me, and I may give it to whomever I wish. All this will be yours, if you worship me.” Jesus said to him in reply, “It is written
