

From Father Rodney

Suffering is not an enjoyable part of life however it is very much part of the human condition. Of course, suffering can come in many different forms. It can be due to an illness such as cancer or any other types of diseases. Suffering can come in the form of a divorce or the death of a loved one. Suffering can also be emotional or psychological or even mental. The reality of suffering is that although we might try our best to avoid it, all of us, at one time or another in our lives, will suffer.

The First Reading we read this 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time speaks of a specific type of suffering. The type of suffering that the reading refers to is the type of suffering comes to us in the cruelty others do to us. This cruelty is driven by self-centered egos that want only comfort in life and will not tolerate any challenge to be more than they can be. The letter of James calls this “jealousy and selfish ambition.” It’s a refusal to acknowledge our own ongoing need for conversion. This is exactly the type of suffering our Lord endured. The Chief Priests and leaders of the Jewish People knew that Jesus was spot on as He delivered His message, yet they feared that they would lose their coveted power over the people if they allowed Him to continue to preach and teach. In an effort to diffuse the situation they simply put Him to death. The “jealousy and selfish ambition” of the Scribes, Pharisees and Leaders of the Jewish People was not going anywhere. Their stubbornness of heart did not allow them to move out of that conditioned mode of thinking.

I am fairly certain that we all know people like the Scribes and Pharisees who are so selfish and stuck in their ways that they will do anything and everything humanly possible to make themselves look good even if it means making other people suffer. We need to pray for people like this and challenge them with fraternal charity. Yes, suffering is certainly part of the human condition but sometimes we need to distance ourselves who will make us suffer needlessly.

Preparation for Adult Confirmation

The diocesan program for those adults seeking to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation is intended to provide catechetical instruction in the faith. **Prior to registration, candidates must begin this process by meeting with the pastor** to gather canonical documents, determine if there are any impediments to the reception of the sacrament, as well as the desire and disposition of the inquirer requesting the sacrament. Candidates should submit a certificate of Baptism to their pastor if they were not baptized in this parish. This year's preparation through the Diocese of Fall River is a hybrid program, with both virtual and in-person sessions for candidates to attend in the Fall. Online Thursdays from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm via Zoom (Oct. 7, 21, 28, Nov. 14) In person Saturday mornings from 10:00 am to 12 noon (Oct. 16, Nov. 6, Dec. 4) Confirmation will take place December 9 at 7:00 pm at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption, Fall River. Faith Formation program will resume in-person classes for all grades - schedules are as follows:

Grades 1 and 2: Will be held on Tuesday from 4:15 – 5:30 p.m. – Saturday, 10:00 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. every other week. **First class begins Tuesday, September 21st and Saturday, September 25th**

Grades 3, 4, and 5 is a non-sacramental preparation for your son/daughter therefore the program for these grades will be home-based. To assist parents/guardian with this program a grade appropriate book will be provided along with a lesson syllabus to assist families. Workshops are scheduled (not mandatory) to be held at Saint Mark church hall to review unit lessons including group activities that coincide with the church calendar.

Grades 6 and 7: Will be held on Monday evenings from 6:30 – 7:45 p.m. once a month. **The first class for sixth grade is Monday, September 20th, and grade seven is Monday, September 27th.**

Grades 8 and 9: Will be held on Wednesday evenings from 6:30 – 7:45 p.m. once a month. **The first class for eighth grade was held Wednesday, September 15th.**

Due to the large enrollment for **ninth** grade, the students will be divided into two groups A and B. Group A – students with the last name A-K. Group B – students with last name L-Z .

The first class for Group A (A-K) will be Wednesday, September 22nd

Group B (L-Z) will be Wednesday, September 29th.
